- 02 Have a suitable level of language, literacy, numeracy and digital to complete course requirements with or without additional support that Oscar Institute is able to provide.
- 03 Must be a proficient user of advanced calculators.
- 04 Have successfully completed Australian Year 10 or equivalent or must be of matured age with adequate LLND skills.
- 05 Are at least at age of 18 on the date of course commencement.
- 06 Student must have access to a working PC or laptop with a configuration suitable to meet study requirements. Please seek your trainer/assessor assistance in this regard.
- 07 Student must have sound digital literacy and access to working internet.

Please Note: It is highly recommended that students must have successfully completed 'CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry', prior to commencing this course as this unit of competency is a pre-requisite to most of the units contained within the qualification.
